

## New Educational Videos

### A Great Way to Help Strengthen Your Community's Response to Stalking and Teenage Victims of Crime

The National Center for Victims of Crime, in partnership with the Office of Community Oriented Policing Services, U.S. Department of Justice, has produced two new video programs to help victim service providers foster more effective, coordinated community responses to stalking victims and teenage victims of crime. Produced in a compelling documentary style, these video programs are ideal for conference presentations, in-service trainings, introductory meetings with local law enforcement agencies and school systems, and other training/educational settings.

Each video program includes an accompanying discussion guide for facilitators and trainers to help ensure viewers understand core concepts. The discussion guide includes additional information about the issue, suggestions on ways to use the video, and a series of thought-provoking questions (and suggested responses) that can be used to facilitate discussions.

#### Links in the Chain: Two Communities Respond to Stalking

Produced by Academy-award® winning documentary filmmakers Citizen Film and Women's Educational Media, this video features two jurisdictions that successfully use multidisciplinary, collaborative responses to stalking: **The New York Anti-Stalking Task Force**, a completely volunteer initiative that provides a unique forum for a wide range of professionals from a six-county area to consult on individual stalking cases, and **The Family Violence Center**, a one-stop unit of the San Jose Police Department that stresses a victim-centric approach to policing and houses law enforcement, prosecution, and victim services under one roof. **Los Angeles Police Chief William Bratton** stresses the importance of developing partnerships to address the problem of stalking. #### Because Things Happen Every Day: Responding to Teenage Victims of Crime

Produced by CastleWorks Productions, the award-winning producers of the PBS teen program *In the Mix*, this video features two innovative victim assistance programs (SafePlace in Austin, Texas, and the STAR program in Westchester County, New York) that have been highly effective in reaching and responding to teen victims through the use of peer leadership, in-school support groups, one-on-one counseling, and hotlines.

The voices of teens are prominent throughout the video, describing their experiences with crime, as well as what helped them recover their confidence and hope. Discussion guide included. (Video length: approx. 20 minutes)
