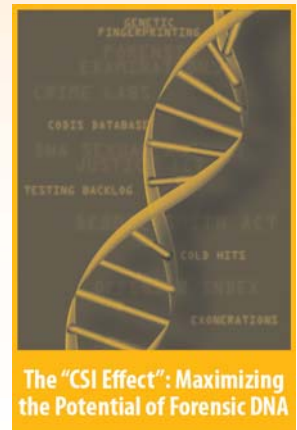
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National Center's Work on DNA

- Education and Advocacy on Capitol Hill
- Survey of the victim services field
- Focus Group on DNA training needs

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Survey of DNA Knowledge, Beliefs, Questions, and Concerns

- Over 750 respondents, mostly victim advocates
- 77% said DNA relevant to their daily work
- 61% had a case with DNA evidence in the past 2 years
- Most common types of cases with DNA evidence were sexual assault, child sexual abuse, and homicide

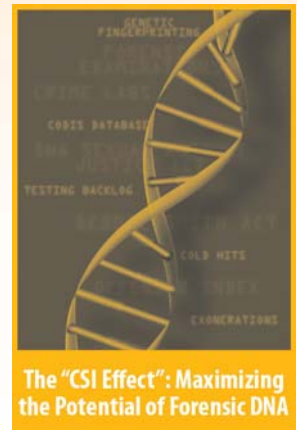
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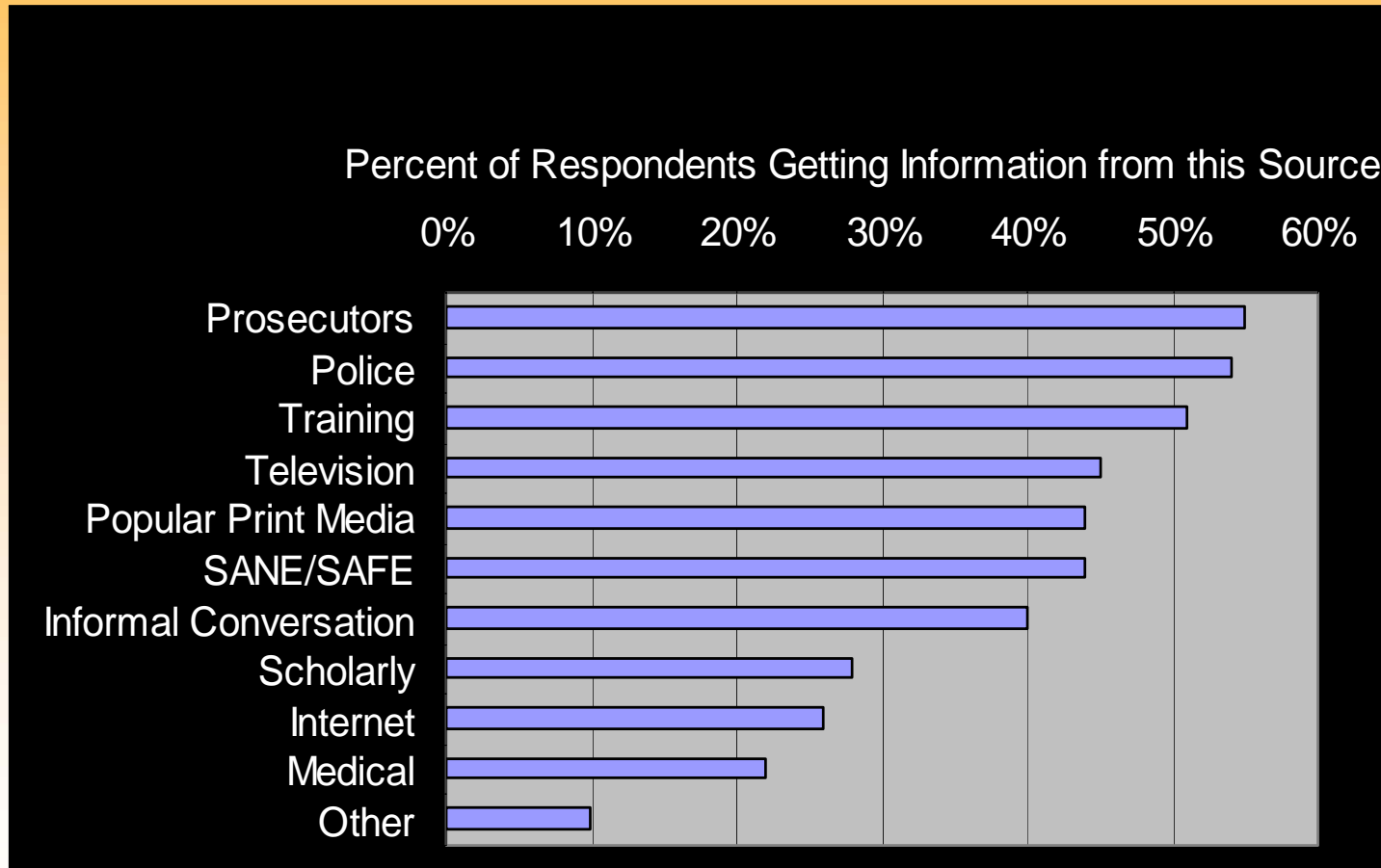
Misconceptions

- 70% believed that victims' DNA profiles are stored in state databases
- 72% believed a DNA profile can show a person's race, and:
- 54% believe HIV status is revealed
- 37% believe hair color is revealed
- 27% believe height is revealed

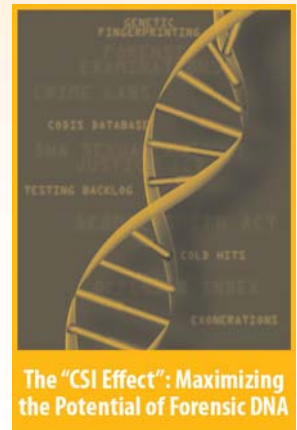
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Sources of Information on DNA



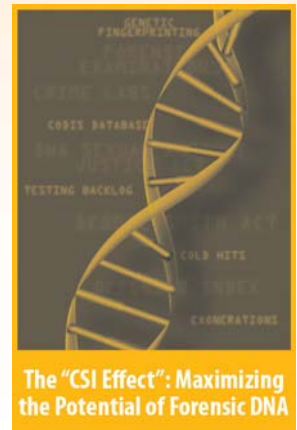
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Informing Victims About DNA

- 88% of respondents had no written information to give to victims about DNA
- 37% weren't sure they could adequately explain the process of DNA collection & testing to victims
- 25% were not able to answer all the victim's questions in their most recent case

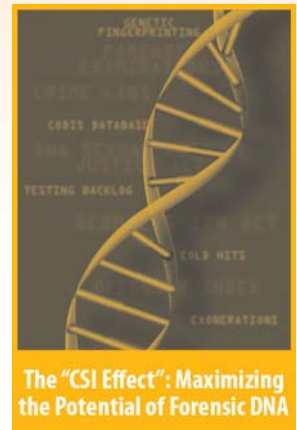
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Top Concerns About DNA

- Underutilization of DNA evidence (50%)
- Inadequate collection & storage (49%)
- Evidence backlogs (48%)
- Victim Privacy (42%)
- Lab errors (30%)
- Less than 20% were concerned about: misuse of DNA info, racial profiling, documentation of a medical condition, expungement, and post-conviction testing

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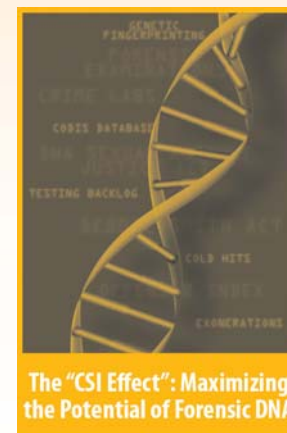


Need for More Training

- 85% said there is a need for more training on DNA
- 81% said they would attend a free or low-cost seminar in their area

“The more I learn about DNA, the better I can serve the community.”

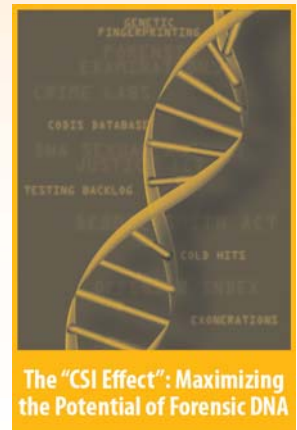
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Focus Group

- Want a continuous up-to-date source of info (Web, person to call, receive e-updates)

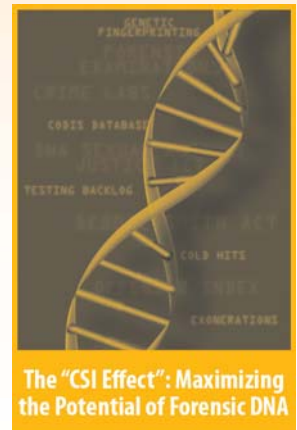
